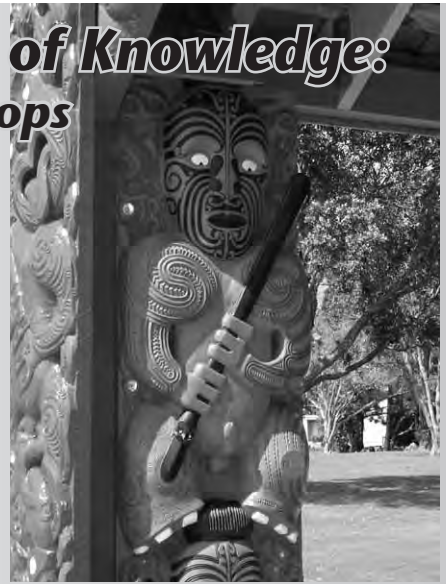




Nāia Kete o te Matauranga - Baskets of Knowledge: 2011 NZAOT Clinical Workshops
